## Re: Letter of Support, House Bill 154: Environment - Green Building Council

Dear Delegate Conway and Committee Members:

The Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) supports House Bill 154: <u>Environment - Green</u> <u>Building Council</u>. Currently the Maryland Green Building Council's responsibilities are focused on implementing green building technologies at State facilities. The legislation would explicitly direct the Council to provide recommendations on expanding green building practices and technologies statewide.

The use of green building technologies provides significant environmental benefit. They promote energy efficiency, low impact design, responsible stormwater management, and the use of recyclable materials in building construction. It is important that the State have one entity responsible for assessing and promoting the use of green building technologies for both the public and private sectors. A comprehensive evaluation of these practices is needed. MDE is represented on the Council and welcomes the opportunity to lend its expertise and advice in fulfilling this expanded role of the Council.
