As the Chair of the Maryland Commission on Climate Change, the Maryland Department of the Environment supports HB 349. The requirements of this bill help to reduce Maryland's emissions. In doing so, the legislation supports the State's overall goal to reduce greenhouse gasses 25% by 2020, as mandated by the Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reduction Act of 2009.
