Re: Letter of Information, Senate Bill 221: Environment - Decabrominated Diphenyl Ether -Trace Amounts

Dear Senator Conway and Committee Members:

The Maryland Department of the Environment supports SB 221 which adds an allowable *de minimus* concentration of one tenth of 1% to the existing controls on deca-BDE. This will facilitate recycling as allowed in the existing statute and remove regulatory uncertainty where the concentrations clearly indicate that deca-BDE was not added as a flame retardant. We have heard credible concerns from various industrial interests and believe this will address their concerns without in any way compromising the intent of the existing statute.
