#### Tidal Wetlands Regulations: Living Shoreline Protection Act of 2008

Background: House Bill 973, entitled the Living Shoreline Protection Act of 2008, was signed into law by Governor O'Malley on April 24, 2008. The Bill focuses on the retention of natural shoreline form, habitat and ecological function and, where shoreline protection is necessary, mandates the use of wetland creation and habitat enhancement projects wherever technologically and ecologically appropriate. The Bill requires the Maryland Department of the Environment to (1) map areas appropriate for structural shoreline stabilization measures; (2) establish a waiver process for individuals that can demonstrate that nonstructural shoreline stabilization is not feasible; and (3) adopt regulations to implement the provisions of the law in cooperation with the Maryland Department of Natural Resources.

Current Status: Two meetings are scheduled to finalize the Living Shorelines regulations. On July 9<sup>th</sup>, Assistant Attorney General Emily Vainieri is scheduled to meet with the Regulations Coordinator for the Critical Area Commission to discuss outstanding format issues and on July 16<sup>th</sup>, staff from the Program and Critical Area Commission is scheduled to meet and resolve any outstanding issues. The Program has updated the regulations schedule based on the assumption that both these meeting will prove successful.
