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2014 Departmental Legislation

HB11 - Bay Restoration Fund (BRF) – Authorized Uses

- Allows flexibility to provide funding for the connection of septic systems outside the Priority Funding Area (PFA) to a public sewer system operating at ENR using BRF septic funds
- The funding will be subject to the current PFA exception process that exists under § 5–7B–06 of the State Finance and Procurement Article, which provides for review and comment by the Smart Growth Coordinating Committee
- The project must also be consistent with a public health area of concern identified in the county water and sewer plan

HB12 - Bay Restoration Fund – Authorized Uses – Local Entities

- Allow up to 10% of the Bay Restoration Fund-Septic revenue to be used for costs incurred by County Health Departments or other delegated parties responsible for implementing Best Available Technology (BAT) septic systems regulations
- Funds can be used for activities such as plan review, construction inspection, and tracking of mandatory operation and maintenance of BAT



2014 Departmental Legislation

- SB101 Maryland Drinking Water Revolving Loan Fund – Technical Correction
 - Authorizes the State Drinking Water Revolving Loan Fund to use federal funds to provide all forms of financial assistance, including grants, consistent with federal law
 - Similar authority is already available in the Water Quality Revolving Loan Fund





Accounting for Growth Update

 After the stakeholder's final report two important unresolved issues:

- Determining how much pollution a new development should be allowed to contribute to the Bay (its loading "baseline") before having to offset any remaining pollution; and
- Whether or not, and when and where, to require offsets for phosphorous in addition to nitrogen
- Additional proposals were identified, evaluated and discussed







The State's Compromise Proposal

Stormwater Baseline Issue

- Except for development on forest land, no stormwater offset will be required if the project uses Environment Site Design to the Maximum Extent Practicable
- For development on forest land, the difference between the forest load and the developed load must be offset

Offsetting Phosphorus

- Recognize that, in general, practices to reduce nitrogen will adequately control phosphorus, but
- After the midpoint assessment of 2017, evaluate whether offsets should be required for local streams, ponds and reservoirs that are impaired for phosphorus





Next Steps

- The State will develop two additional refinements
 - Determine whether phosphorus offsets should be immediately required, either State-wide or in streams, ponds and reservoirs that are impaired for phosphorus
 - Determine how developers could receive credits for reductions beyond ESD to the MEP
- The State will prepare draft regulatory language based on the compromise proposal and solicit comments from stakeholders prior to making any formal proposal



Marcellus Shale Update

Executive Order June 2011

- Purpose: help State policymakers and regulators determine whether and how gas production from the Marcellus shale in Maryland can be accomplished without unacceptable risks
- Studies to be done by MDE and DNR in consultation with an Advisory Commission
- Charge: Look at long-term, shortterm and cumulative impacts of shale gas development





Status of Recommendations

Recommendation	Status
Presumptive Impact Zone for Drinking Water Contamination	SB636/HB1123 passed and became law 2012
Financial Assurance Requirements for Gas Wells	SB854 passed and became law in 2013
Registration of Land Professionals	SB766/HB828 passed and became law in 2013
State-level Severance Tax	Will be introduced again in 2014
Surface Owners Protection Act	Advisory Commission failed to reach agreement on content
Funding for Studies	FY 2013 Deficiency Allowance of \$1.5 million

- Best Practices
 - Draft issued June 2013
 - 4000+ comments received
 - Final to be issued in Spring 2014
- Final Report
 - Integrate results of all the studies and research
 - To be issued in August 2014
