Re: Letter of Concern, House Bill 118: Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reductions – Progress Report – Ocean Acidification

Dear Delegate McIntosh and Committee Members:

The Maryland Department of the Environment has reviewed House Bill 118, *Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reductions – Progress Report – Ocean Acidification*, and would like to share some information on this legislation with the Committee.

The Department agrees with the intent of the bill, which is to analyze the science on ocean acidification, determine its effects on the ecology of State waters and fisheries, and develop potential strategies to mitigate those affects. However, the Department is concerned with the potential fiscal impact the bill would have on the Department. The Department does not have the staff level expertise to complete the required study and would need to contract with a third party to complete the study. The Department estimates the cost for the study to meet the bill's requirements to be \$375,000. Funding for the study is not included in the Department's proposed FY 2015 budget.
