Re: Senate Bill 564 – Environment – Water Pollution Control – Penalty

Dear Chairwoman McIntosh and Committee Members:

The Maryland Department of the Environment has reviewed Senate Bill 564, *Environment – Water Pollution Control – Penalty*, and would like to express our support for this bill.

SB 564 would double the penalty exposure for administrative actions under 9-342 from a daily maximum of \$5,000 per day to \$10,000 per day and would also raise the administrative cap for cases from \$50,000 to \$100,000.

violations enhances the State's overall efforts to curb and reduce pollution to Maryland's waterways, tributaries, and the Chesapeake Bay through enhanced deterrence and potentially increasing the number of

enforcement authority more consistent with federal authority under the Clean Water Act, which MDE is delegated to implement in Maryland.
