MWG members will discuss the recommendations in this order:

- Recommendation 22: Modify STRIDE to reduce ratepayer costs and facilitate electrification
- Recommendation 23: Align state spending with climate goals
- Recommendation 24: End SEIF support for fossil fuel projects
- Recommendation 25: Remove incineration as an eligible source in RPS
- Recommendation 26: Require that state funds are not used for fossil fuel projects
- Recommendation 27: Sunset financial incentives for fossil fuel appliances/systems in EmPOWER
- Recommendation 13: Allow the state to regulate greenhouse gas emissions from manufacturing (10 for, 3 opposed via online vote)
- Recommendation 21: Fund EV incentives with increased registration fees on fuel-burning vehicles (this recommendation wasn't part of online voting)
- Recommendation 20: Provide funding for EV readiness projects (8 for, 2 opposed via online vote)
- Recommendation 16: Align BEPS requirements with availability of federal and state funding (7 for, 6 opposed via online vote)
- Recommendation 14: Create a prescriptive pathway for BEPS compliance (6 for, 4 opposed via online vote)
