Washington State Efforts to Achieve Clean Cars 2030 Target



- Advanced Clean Cars II (ZEV for 2026-2035)
 - Ongoing rulemaking will finalize by end of 2022
- Advanced Clean Trucks (ZEV for medium- and heavy-duty trucks)
 - Adopted in November 2021
- Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Mapping and Forecasting Tool
 - Maps locations of existing and planned EV charging stations
 - Identifies gaps in EVSE network
 - Requires electric utilities to plan for EV adoption in their service area
- Environmental Justice / Equitable Transition
 - Zero Emission Access Grant Program ZEV Carshare grants in disadvantaged communities
 - Healthy Environment for All Act (HEAL Act) of 2022
- ZEV Incentives available in Washington State
 - Sales tax exemption for New and Used ZEV Purchases (price limits)
 - Working on getting "on the hood" time of purchase incentives



Interagency EV Coordinating Council

- Jointly led by Depts. of Commerce & Transportation
 - Participating agencies: Ecology, Health, Agriculture, utility regulators, others
- Responsibilities:
 - Develop statewide transportation electrification strategy
 - Identify EV infrastructure funding opportunities & coordinate grant funding across state agencies
 - Develop outreach plan for engaging with communities & local govts.
 - Create industry EV advisory committee
 - Ensure electrification benefits vulnerable & overburdened communities
- Report annually to Legislature
- Create scoping plan for Clean Cars 2030 by Dec. 31, 2023
