
## **Site History**

- 1887 First Furnace at Sparrows Point Built
- 1916 Bethlehem Steel Corporation Purchases Facility
- 1930 Coke Ovens Begin Operation
- 1950 Tin Mill Canal Construction Begins
- 1959 Peak Production at Facility Requires Operation of:
  - 12 Coke-oven Batteries
  - 10 Blast Furnaces
  - 4 Open-hearth Furnaces
- 1970 Tin Mill Canal Construction Cease
- 1991 Coke Ovens Operations Cease
- Present Day L Blast Furnace and Basic Oxygen Furnace (BOF) Operating






## **1916 Shoreline Map**













- Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) 1976
- Consent Decree Under Authority of Section 3008 (h)
- Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments 1984
- Clean Air Act 1970, Amended 1990
- Maryland Department of the Environment 1987







- October 1997-United States of America and State of Maryland Department of the Environment v. Bethlehem Steel Corporation; Docket No. JFM-97-558 and JFM-97-559
- Consent Decree Binds EPA, MDE, Bethlehem Steel Corporation And All Future Owners To Complete Specific Tasks
  - Provides Technical Guidance And A "Rulebook" For All Participants







### **1997 Consent Decree Tasks**

#### **CORRECTIVE MEASURES (EPA LEAD)**

- Site Wide Investigation (RCRA Assessment)
  - Human Health Risk Assessment
  - Ecological Risk Assessment (on and off-site)
  - Groundwater Assessment
- Interim Measures
- Corrective Measures Study (CMS)





#### WASTE MINIMIZATION (EPA/MDE WITH CURRENT AND PREVIOUS OWNERS)

- Inspection of all Sumps, Above Ground Tanks and Trenches
- Evaluate Tin Mill Canal Discharges
- Beneficial Reuse of Strong Caustic Solutions at Humphreys
  Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant
- Recycle Basic Oxygen Furnace (BOF) and Blast Furnace Air Emission Treatment Sludge
- Recycle Humphreys Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant Sludge






#### **COMPLIANCE (MDE LEAD)**

- Compliance Requirements-Air
  - Visible Emissions from Basic Oxygen Furnace (BOF) Shop Roof Monitor
  - Kish Reduction
- Compliance Requirements-Solid Waste Landfills (Greys and Coke Point)
  - Operations manual
  - Engineering Study
  - Compliance Plan
  - Monitoring
  - Closure Plan

## **A Few Consent Decree Milestones**

- Description of Current Conditions Report- January 1998
- Interim Measure Rod and Wire Mill Pump and Treat System Operational-September 2001
- Completion of Kish Reduction Plan-2004
- Sump/Tank Work Plan-Repairs Completed-2004/with ongoing inspection and repairs
- Site Wide Investigation Report of Nature and Extent of Releases to Groundwater from Special Study Areas-January 2005
- CA725 Facility Investigation and Human Health Risk Evaluation (HHRE) Findings-June 2005
- Greys Landfill Stabilization and Compliance Measures Completed-December 2008

- 2001 Bethlehem Steel declares bankruptcy
- 2003 International Steel Corporation (ISG) acquires Steel Mill
- 2005 ISG acquired by Mittal
- 2006 Mittal merges with Arcelor
- 2007 Federal Court orders sale of Steel Mill in February
- 2008 Severstal acquires Sparrows Point Steel Mill on May 8th
