The Conoco Inc. site is a petroleum product storage terminal.

1985 PA by WAS states that although CERCLA reports were submitted for the Conoco Inc. site, Conoco claims that the site never handled hazardous waste.

EPA assigned NFRAP status in May Site History 1985.

Conoco Inc. Baltimore, MD

Site Location

Conoco Inc. is located at 3410 Fairfield Road in the Fairfield district of Baltimore City. Conoco Chemical Company borders the facility to the south, two small residential areas lie to the north and west of the property, and the eastern border is defined by Fairfield Road. Groundwater and surface water flow north and east to the Patapsco River.

Conoco Inc. was a petroleum product storage terminal jointly shared by Conoco and Sunoco.

Environmental Investigations

A Preliminary Assessment (PA) of the Conoco site was completed in April 1985 by the Maryland Waste Management Administration (WAS). The PA states that according to Mr. Ed Keough, an environmental engineer for Conoco, Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA; 1980) reports were submitted for all of Conoco's facilities regardless of whether a site contained hazardous waste or not, in order to assure legal compliance. He stated that the Conoco Inc. site never handled hazardous waste. In response to a query about the cleaning of storage tanks and the disposal of leaded tank bottoms, Mr. Keough replied that "tank bottoms were nonreportable." The PA recommended that a low priority site investigation with appropriate sampling be conducted.

Current Status

Based on the 1985 PA, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) assigned the Conoco Inc. site No Further Remedial Action Planned (NFRAP) status in May 1985. Further evaluation, if necessary, will be addressed by the State Superfund Division.
