Greetings!

As I'm sure you have noted from the reports of testing I've been sending you, MTBE levels in the water wells at the 7-Eleven Store #22281 at 2400 Pleasantville Road in Fallston, Maryland, have been very low for the past year; the last 12 monthly samples taken showed an average MTBE concentration of less than 4.2 parts per billion before treatment, and no detectable levels after treatment.

You may also be interested to learn that the gasoline storage and delivery systems at this 7-Eleven site are scheduled to be upgraded, with work starting this coming September, 2008, and continuing for several weeks.

This upgrade is part of 7-Eleven's national program to not only replace all its steel tanks with new fiberglass double-walled tanks, but also to upgrade the fuel-delivery, fuel-transfer and fuel-dispensing technologies at all its gasoline stations, and to install state-of-the-art backup and environmental protection systems.

Although gasoline retail operations will of course be suspended during the upgrade process, testing of the potable water wells will continue unabated.
