FOR the purpose of requiring the Office of Recycling in the Department of the
Environment to include certain elements in the State's recycling plan for State
government; requiring State agencies and units of State government to
implement the plan by a certain date; deleting certain obsolete dates; and
generally relating to requirements for recycling for State government.

HOUSE BILL 595

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 (a) [By July 1, 1990, the] **THE** Office of Recycling, in cooperation with the 6 Department of General Services and other State agencies, shall develop a recycling 7 plan that reduces by recycling the amount of the solid waste stream generated for 8 disposal by the State government by at least 20 percent or to an amount that is 9 determined practical and economically feasible, but in no case may the amount to be 10 recycled be less than 10 percent.

(B) BY JULY 1, 2010, THE RECYCLING PLAN UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF
 THIS SECTION SHALL INCLUDE A SYSTEM FOR RECYCLING ALUMINUM, GLASS,
 PAPER, AND PLASTIC GENERATED FOR DISPOSAL BY THE STATE GOVERNMENT,
 INCLUDING THE PLACEMENT OF COLLECTION BINS IN STATE-OWNED OR
 STATE-OPERATED OFFICE BUILDINGS <u>IN LOCATIONS IN THE STATE WHERE IT IS</u>
 DETERMINED TO BE PRACTICAL AND ECONOMICALLY FEASIBLE.

17 [(b)] (C) By January 1, [1992] **2012,** each State agency and unit of State 18 government shall implement the recycling plan required under [subsection (a) of] this 19 section.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 21 October 1, 2009.
