Notice of Tentative Determination and Public Hearing

In accordance with Sections 1-601, 1-602, 1-604, and 9-209 of the Environment Article, <u>Annotated Code of Maryland</u>, the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) has made a Tentative Determination to approve a Refuse Disposal Permit Application submitted by National Waste Managers, Inc. for the proposed Chesapeake Terrace Rubble Landfill to be located along Patuxent Road in Odenton, Maryland. The proposed Chesapeake Terrace Rubble Landfill is a non-hazardous solid waste acceptance facility that proposes to accept land clearing debris and construction and demolition debris for disposal and/or recycling.

A Public Hearing is scheduled for <u>Thursday</u>, <u>February 23, 2023 at 5:00 pm</u> at the Double Tree by Hilton Hotel located at 210 Holiday Court, Annapolis, Maryland 21401, in the Coastal Room and Lower Lobby. The Public Hearing will be held to provide the citizens an opportunity to formally comment on MDE's Tentative Determination concerning the proposed landfill. Public Informational Meetings concerning this application were previously held on July 14, 1994 at the Arundel Middle School located at 1179 Hammond Lane, Odenton, Maryland 21113, on December 3, 2001 at the Odenton Volunteer Fire Hall located at 1425 Annapolis Road, Odenton, Maryland 21113, and on November 21, 2019 and May 24, 2022 at the Double Tree by Hilton Hotel located at 210 Holiday Court, Annapolis, Maryland 21401.

Upon prior request, MDE will provide an interpreter for the deaf or hearing-impaired persons. The permit application, supporting documents, and draft permit will be available for public review at the Anne Arundel Public Library (Odenton Branch) located at 1325 Annapolis Road, Odenton, Maryland 21113 and at MDE by appointment after January 24, 2023 and on the MDE website:
