3.10 COAL MINING OPERATOR LICENSE

Question: Am I responsible for a coal mining operation?

Why do I need this approval?

Maryland requires that anyone responsible for a coal mining operation obtain a mining operator license from the Department.

The purpose of the license is to ensure that coal mining operations meet the Department's environmental standards, have proper credentials, have acceptable track records in Maryland and elsewhere, and meet financial accountability requirements.

What laws or regulations give MDE the legal authority to issue this approval?

FEDERAL: Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act of 1977, 30 U.S.C.A §1201, et seq. STATE: Environment Article, Title 15, Subtitle 5 and 6; Sections 15-504 and 15-605.

What is the process to get this approval?

 Submit the completed application to: Maryland Department of the Environment Bureau of Mines
South Water Street Frostburg, MD 21532
The Department will review the application for completeness and verify that the applicant has not forfeited a bond in Maryland or in any other state.

Are there any other requirements?

The application shall include the following: a) Identify if the application is for open pit or deep mine;

b) Identify the business structure for the applicant, such as: corporation, partnership, association, individual, or other;

c) If the applicant is a corporation, indicate state in which incorporated, date of incorporation, name and address of resident agent; and d) Include verification that the business has been registered with the Maryland Department of Assessment and Taxation.

How long should I expect it to take to get this approval once I submit a complete application? 30 days

Once I get this approval, how long will it last?

One year, January 1 to December 31.

How much will this approval cost?

Do I need to know any additional information?

The applicant will be denied a renewal if violations or corrective actions in Maryland or other states have not been corrected.
