Cold Water Advisory Committee Meeting Highlights (April 20th 2018):

- Committee members introduced themselves and provided a brief overview of the perspective they represent
- MDE's Water Quality Standards Section (WQS) provided an overview of how MDE re-designates stream Use Classes and data requirements
- EASP highlighted the need to formalize a process to protect coldwater obligate species in streams that are located in Use Class I or IV waters
- WQS gave a presentation and answered questions regarding the Clean Water Act and associated
 Water Quality Standards
- WQS described how "existing uses" are articulated in Federal Statutes and Maryland regulations
- The major objective of the committee were enumerated
- The first objective (the development of an MDE policy that protects streams with coldwater obligate species in advance of changing the use classification) was discussed under different scenarios
- Action items were compiled
